Executive Summary

ACHR welcomes the adoption of the Commission Resolution 16 on the Promotion of Effective Monitoring for Investigations and Information Gathering (on Article 8, Protocol).

The resolution, among others, calls international and regional organizations to provide support to the implementation of the process, ACHR commends the East African Police Commissioners Conference (EAPCC) for their creation of a Member's Working Procedure (MWP) in recognizing that investigating the member process. The MWP provides a clear procedure to handle rights complaint concerning the activities of the Commission and effectiveness of the process. I commend as a important example of action to take not only a case study for across the continent.

ACHR further welcomes the willingness of the Kenya National Police Services to accept the implementation of the MWP through a series of the trial and national institutions and training or intensive process.
